Epiphany is a time of God's glory manifested and revealed in Jesus Christ.



Council Perspective

"Be still and know I am God. I will be exalted among the nations. I will be exalted in the earth." ... "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God."

The season of Advent is upon us. It is a time of expectation, hope, and preparation. As I begin this Advent journey to Christmas 2019. my calendar has exploded and the preparation for each event has propelled me faster and faster. From a musician's perspective, people demand hearing the message and spirit of so many Christmas Carols including classics such as The Messiah. From a father's perspective, my family furiously attempts how to bring us all together to celebrate the joyous occasion yet one more time. As chairperson of church council, I try to serve as a hub for church business and activities that seem to multiply and flourish this time of year.

In all these perspectives, expectations run so high. We furiously increase our pace during our Advent journey in attempt to be prepared for that perfect moment. We race from event to event, chore to chore, all in attempt to reach that point. It is also a time of transition. A time of some connection between where we are now and a future moment, a new year, a new and renewed way of living with Christ.

At All Saints, we seem to be not only in the transition that the season of Advent brings, but also one that potentially brings newness and change in our ministry at our church. With Pastor Jeff's retirement announcement, new ministry leadership is now being planned. Council members and I are now are in the time of preparation, hope, and expectation of a new Pastor /

Priest and what that will bring to our community. Yes, our pace and workload has increased substantially. For all of us at All Saints, we are in the midst two seasons of transition.

Yet scripture assures us amidst our hurried pace. "Be still and know I am God." "Do not be anxious about anything...." We are invited into a moment of stillness to contemplate this assurance. I hope all of us will seek out these moments of stillness amid our rush and rest in this assurance.

A few Council highlights include the ongoing plans for our next Pastor / Priest. As previously announced. I have been in contact with both bishops. Bishop Susan and Bishop Michael have appointed two representatives, one from each of the wider churches, to lead us through the process of searching for new spiritual leadership. Canon Terry Deforest and Rev. Doug Reble will be meeting with Church Council on Wednesday December 11th to explore a

joint process that will likely include an appointment of an Interim Minister in the coming months. Also being planned for the near future is an "exit interview" for Pastor Jeff that would include outlining perceptions of his ministry at All Saints as well as of our

congregation. I would expect the overall process may also include the formation of a "Call team" made from Council or cross section of the church who would lead us through the transition. I will update you not only through Connections but also email blasts and announcements as they become available.

Our street sign project is firmly in the works now after being approved by Council. It is now in the hands of the sign company who is presently seeking approval of the site design with the City of Guelph. They have indicated that we may see the sign completed later in January depending on

approvals and weather factors.

Council has now fully costed and researched the "accessible

power outside doors" to our building. We had anticipated a Government Grant opportunity in November but while researching this, have found out that the next round of grants for such a project will actually be in 2020...the new year. We are at least thoroughly prepared for when that opportunity comes. Forms

have been completed and estimates sought out.



Suggestions for Handling Grief During the Holiday Season

The time leading up to Christmas, and Christmas itself is, for many, the happiest and most joyful time of the year. But for those who have experienced recent loss (death of a loved one, loss of relationship, loss of employment etc), it can be difficult, isolating, sad and lonely. If you find yourself in that space this year, here are some suggestions to help:

- Remember that love does not end with death. The memories of love shared will always hold a place in your heart. Visit that place inside frequently for strength and encouragement.
- 2. **Talk about your grief**. Don't be afraid to express what you're feeling to caring friends and family.
- 3. Be gentle with yourself. Feelings of loss may leave you feeling lethargic and fatigued. Respect what your body and mind are telling you.
- 4. Eliminate unnecessary stress. Avoid too much isolation, but recognize the need to have time for yourself. Pace yourself.

- 5. Be with supportive, caring people. Identify those who may understand what you are going through and make sure to spend time with them.
- If you are experiencing the death of a loved one – talk about the one who has died. Don't avoid using their name in conversation. This allows others to do the same.
- 7. Do what is right for you during the holidays. Well-meaning friends and family often try to prescribe what is good for you during the holidays. Be aware of your own needs and express them.
- 8. Plan ahead for family and holiday gatherings. Decide which family traditions you want to continue and which new ones you would like to begin. As you make your plans, leave room to change them if you feel it is appropriate and what you need to do.
- 9. Do something for someone else. Reaching out to someone else who is in need can help with your

- own feelings of helplessness and hopelessness.
- 10. Express your faith.
 Remember that the
 Christmas message is
 Emmanuel 'God is with us'
 light in our darkness, joy
 in our sadness, hope in our
 despair. Find healing and
 comfort in the
 strengthening love of your
 church family.

Church is not an organization you join; it is a FAMILY where you belong, a home where you are loved and a hospital where you find healing.
