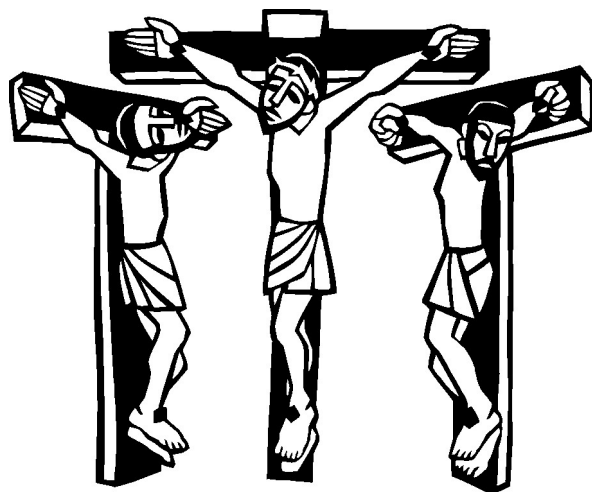

First Reading: *Isaiah 52:13—53:12*

See, my servant shall prosper;
he shall be exalted and lifted up,
and shall be very high.

¹⁴ Just as there were many who were astonished at him*
—so marred was his appearance, beyond human
semblance,

and his form beyond that of mortals—

¹⁵ so he shall startle* many nations;

kings shall shut their mouths because of him;
for that which had not been told them they shall see,
and that which they had not heard they shall
contemplate.

⁵³ Who has believed what we have heard?

And to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?

² For he grew up before him like a young plant,
and like a root out of dry ground;

he had no form or majesty that we should look at him,

 and there was no deceit in his mouth.

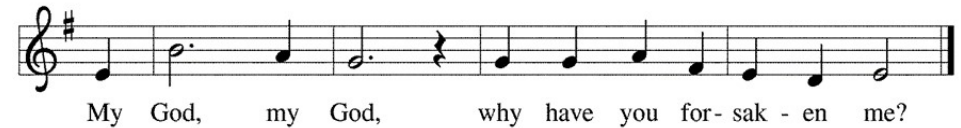
10 Yet it was the will of the Lord to crush him with pain.*

 strong bulls of Bashan surround me. R**

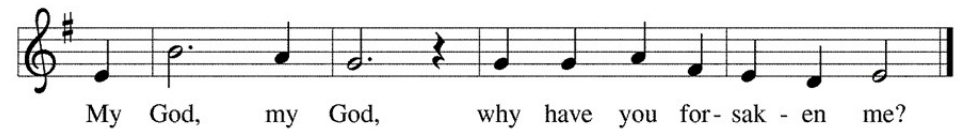
¹³ They open wide their jaws at me,

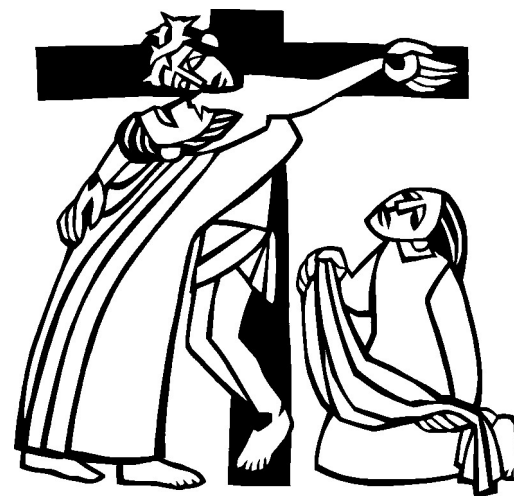
We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you.
