Celebration of Holy Baptism

Sponsors: *We present Summer Lynn Marie Evans to receive the sacrament of Holy Baptism.*

In Holy Baptism God graciously delivers us from sin and death by joining us to the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Through water and the word, the Holy Spirit calls us to walk a new life in God. In this new life, we are joined across time and space to our ancestors who have lived and died trustingly and to the whole Christian community on earth. Their witness supports our Christian journey.

Alex and Mandy, as you bring Summer to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities:

- to live with her among God’s faithful people,
- bringing her to the word of God and the holy supper,
- teaching them the Lord’s Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments,
- placing in her hands the holy scriptures,
- and nurturing her in faith and prayer so that she may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.

Will you help Summer grow in the Christian faith and life?

R: We will, with God’s help.

Ian and Elizabeth, will you nurture Summer in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God’s Spirit, and help her live in the covenant of baptism?

R: I will, with God’s help.

The congregation stands.

People of God, will you uphold and support Summer in her new life in Christ?

We will, with God's help.

To all here gathered, I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church, the faith in which we baptize.

Do you renounce the evil powers of this world that rebel against God?

I renounce them.

Do you renounce the powers of this world that strive to corrupt and destroy God's creation?

I renounce them.

Do you renounce those desires that draw you from the love of God?

I renounce them.

Do you believe in God, the Source of all Being?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Eternal Word?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God, the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sin, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The Lord be with you.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Blessed are you, O God, maker and ruler of all things. Your voice thundered over the waters at creation. You water the mountains and send springs into the valleys to refresh and satisfy us and all living things. Through the waters of the flood, you carried those in the ark to safety. Through the sea, you led your people Israel from slavery to freedom. In the wilderness, you nourished them with water from the rock, and you brought them across the river Jordan to the Promised Land. By the baptism of his death and resurrection, Jesus has carried us to safety and freedom. The floods shall not overwhelm us, the deep shall not swallow us up, for Christ has brought us over to the land of promise. He sends us to make disciples, baptizing in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

AM pours water into the baptismal font.

Pour out your Holy Spirit; wash away sin in this cleansing water; clothe the baptized with Christ; and claim your daughters and sons, no longer Jew or Greek, no longer slave or free, no longer male or female, but one with all the baptized in Christ Jesus, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

The presiding minister uses oil to make the sign of the cross on the person's forehead while saying:

Summer, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.

The presiding minister lays both hands on the baptized person while saying:

All Holy God: as a mother tenderly gathers her children, as a father joyfully welcomes his own, you embrace your people with compassion and grace. We give you thanks for freeing us from the power of sin and for raising us up to a new life through this holy sacrament. Sustain Summer in your Holy Spirit. Give her an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen**

Gracious God, look kindly upon Mandy and Alex, the parents of this child. Let them ever rejoice in the gift you have given them. Make them teachers and examples of righteousness for Summer. Strengthen them in their faith so that they may share eternally the salvation you have given them, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

Sovereign God, give strength and wisdom to all who take up the good work of baptismal sponsorship. Strengthen Elizabeth and Ian in their own convictions, confirm them in their resolve to nurture those yet young in their faith, and help them to be examples of faith active in love, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**





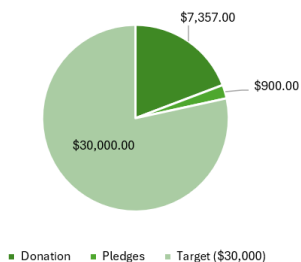
