

Gospel Reading – *Matthew 4: 12 - 23*

Now when Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people.
