FIRST READING: Genesis 32:22-31

Returning to the home he had fled many years before after stealing his brother's birthright and his father's blessing, Jacob wrestles all night long with a divine adversary who ultimately blesses him and changes his name to "Israel," a name that means "he wrestles with God."

²² The same night [Jacob] got up and took his two wives, his two maids, and his eleven children and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. ²³ He took them and sent them across the stream, and likewise everything that he had.

²⁴ Jacob was left alone, and a man wrestled with him until daybreak. ²⁵ When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he struck him on the hip socket, and *Jacob's hip* was put out of joint as he wrestled with him. ²⁶ Then he said, "Let me go, for the day is breaking." But Jacob said, "I will not let you go, unless you bless me." ²⁷ So he said to him, "What is your name?" But he said, "Why is it that you ask my name?" And there he blessed him.

³⁰ So Jacob called the place Peniel, saying, “For I have seen God face to face, yet my life is preserved.” ³¹ The sun rose upon him as he passed Penuel, limping because of his hip.

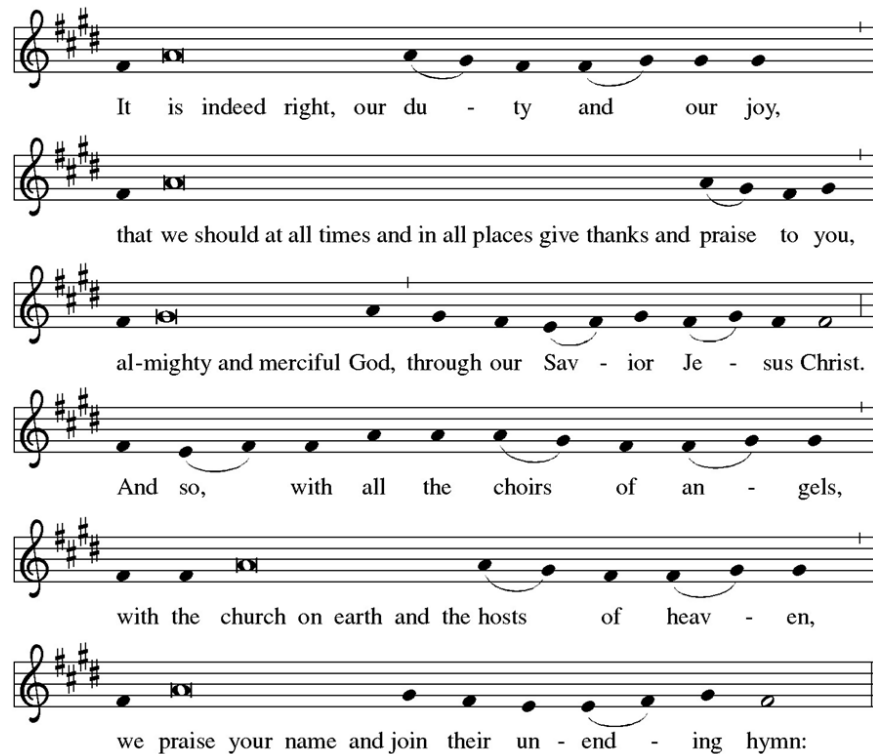

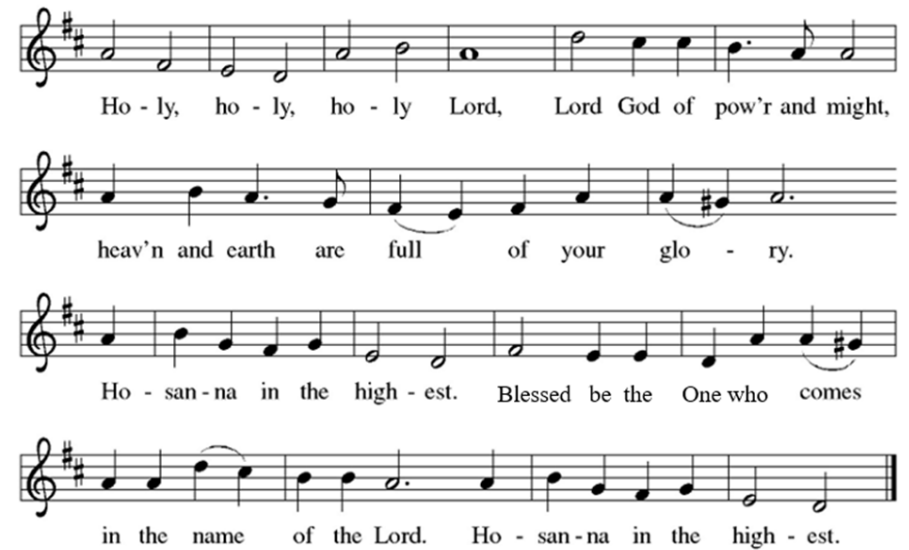

October 26, 4:30 organ recital at St. George's. Angelique Po, one of Canada's finest organists, presents a program that includes Liszt's *Weinen, Klagen, Sorgen, Zagen*, Vaughan Williams' *Three Preludes on Welsh Hymn Tunes*, and Reger's *Wachet Auf*. Our heating and cooling system (HVAC) system is feeling it's age...some 40+ years old. This has affected worship on Sundays, the organ, and others who use our space on a daily basis. In addition, our monthly energy bills have taken an upward climb. Despite multiple attempts by the professionals to adjust and patch the system, the time has come to invest in a new system which would provide for greater efficiencies and longevity.



Church Council has approved the replacement of both the main unit and electronics. **The total projected cost of this is between \$80,000 and \$90,000. Despite having some backup funds, we do not wish to draw heavily on these thus we are asking for donations to this project. As of Sunday October 12th, we have raised \$73,720.00.**

Asexual Awareness Week (Ace Week) in Canada is an international campaign that occurs during the last full week of October to raise awareness and educate the public about asexuality. The week serves to celebrate the asexual community, challenge misconceptions, and promote understanding and acceptance of the asexual spectrum, which includes individuals who experience little or no sexual attraction. It is observed in Canada, just as it is internationally, through online initiatives, educational resources, and community events.



The **asexual flag** is a pride flag representing the asexual community created in 2010 by a member of the Asexual Visibility and Education Network (AVEN). The flag features four horizontal stripes of equal size. From top to bottom, the stripes are black, gray, white, and purple. The black stripe represents asexuality, the gray stripe represents greysexuality and demisexuality, the white stripe represents allosexuality (or, sometimes, allies), and the purple stripe represents the community as a whole. The flag design has been widely accepted and has become a symbol of asexuality.
