We do not need any plastic bread tabs or reuseable grocery bags at this time. Thank you.


Intersex Awareness Day (Oct. 26) seeks to raise awareness about intersex people and the struggles that they face in society. Intersex people have physical or genetic makeup which doesn't fit traditional definitions of male and female. The day celebrates and recognises the unique challenges they face. First celebrated in 1996 in response to the high rates of medical interventions performed on intersex infants and children without the consent or knowledge of the individual. These interventions were often done in the name of "normalising" the child but had the effect of causing psychological and physical harm. Organizations such as the United Nations have also worked to draw attention to the human rights of intersex people and the need for legal

recognition. Yellow and purple were chosen as colours viewed as free from gender associations. The circle is described as "unbroken and unornamented, symbolizing wholeness and completeness, and our potentialities."
