
SECOND READING: Hebrews 10:5-10

- ⁵Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said,
- 'Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body you have prepared for me;
- ⁶ in burnt-offerings and sin-offerings you have taken no pleasure.
- ⁷ Then I said, "See, God, I have come to do your will, O God" (in the scroll of the book it is written of me)."
- ⁸When he said above, 'You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt-offerings and sin-offerings' (these are offered according to the law), ⁹then he added, 'See, I have come to do your will.' He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. ¹⁰And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.





With this bread and cup we remember your Word dwelling among us, full of grace and truth. We remember our new birth in his death and resurrection. We look with hope for his coming.



We, being many, are one body, for we all share in the one bread.






